### D. Report on Clinical Activities:

Clinically, my work focuses on the management of symptom clusters common to many chronic, complex illnesses, including pain, anxiety-depression-insomnia, fatigue, and various unexplained somatic complaints, and stress related disorders. At present, I integrate Functional Medicine with Chinese medicine and collaborate with a network of referring physicians in managing the care complex autoimmune and chronically ill patients often presenting with co-morbid anxiety and depression.
